



UNFOLDING OUR FEATHERS

Our journey began **5 decades ago** when founder Bob Rans, originally exporting Belgian-made design objects to the Middle East, decided to take production into his own hands. Acquiring specialised machinery, Omexco produced its first wallcoverings using textile warps (Fil à Fil), a beautiful technique that gives the wallcoverings their Belgian touch and tactile feel. With time, new colour combinations and patterns were developed, exploring the boundaries of the craft.

By the late 1980s, under the leadership of John Dubaere, we expanded beyond our own

production facility, collaborating with master artisans across Europe and Asia. The search led to handmade techniques and partnerships with small ateliers and introducing new natural elements like mica stones, cork, mother-of-pearl, barks and grasscloths, enriching our collections with materials rarely seen in traditional Belgian production. This evolution marked Omexco's transition from a single-product manufacturer to an **éditeur and manufacturer**.

Today, with over 40 employees and the next generation Dubaere, helping lead the way, Omexco continues to evolve by designing and manufacturing high-end wallcoverings.



WHERE OUR FEATHERS FIND THEIR PATTERN

We draw inspiration from nature and from all over the world. Though at the heart of everything we create is our beautiful Belgium. We are part of a centuries-old tradition of wallcovering artistry, echoing the legacy of the Flemish tapestries that once graced the world's most prestigious interiors. Our roots in the flax-weaving regions of Flanders, where fields of linen shaped both local culture and a mastery of textile know-how, continue to influence our sensibility for structure, softness, and intricate detail. ▶



OMEXCO'S HEAD OF
DESIGN ON WHAT
INSPIRES HER AND
HOW OUR COLLECTIONS
COME TOGETHER

What inspired you to become a designer and how does that inspiration still influence your work within our organisation today?

Growing up, I was always surrounded by materials and colours. In my mother's interior design boutique, I would spend hours as a child playing with scraps of silk, velvet and wallpaper crafted by leading design houses, creating entire worlds for my imaginary characters.

Imagining new worlds has always fascinated me, and the desire to go further - to shape material and continually explore the boundaries of creation - naturally led me to textile design. This intuitive connection with materials and the visual realm has remained the foundation of my work. It sustains my creativity and guides each of my design decisions, helping me bring coherence and meaning to my projects within the company.



If you were to express Omexco's identity in a single form, material or movement, what would that be, and why?


If I had to summarise Omexco's identity in a single shape, material or movement, I would choose the French word "**sublimier**" - "to elevate".

Whether we work with natural fibres or with various printing techniques, our approach remains the same: to reveal the essence of the material, refine every detail and create a coherent dialogue between texture and craftsmanship.

How can we elevate the noblest materials? Should we weave them? Use them in marquetry? How do we combine aesthetics, sustainability and high performance? These are the questions we ask ourselves as we develop our collections. ►

The creative process is never a solitary one. How do the people around you influence your perspective and your choices?

Each collection begins with a desire - to work with a specific material, for example, to develop a wood-focused collection, or to imagine a high-performance line. It is a true dialogue between Thomas, our director, the product manager and myself. Together, we define this new vision, which the creative team then brings to life. Thanks to our shared sensibility and experience, we often perceive emerging trends before they fully take shape on the market. This intuition naturally guides our creative choices.

Our clients around the world also play a role in our decisions. We make deliberate choices, knowing that certain collections will resonate more strongly in some markets than in others. Every decision regarding patterns, materials or colours serves a dual purpose: meeting our clients' expectations and carrying Omexco's identity forward.

What trends do you see emerging, and how do you envisage Omexco's role within them?

Today's emerging trends reveal a growing need for meaning and authenticity. We are seeing a return to shorter production chains, a renewed appreciation of artisanal practices and increased interest in local craftsmanship. This shift reflects a clear call for **more responsible, transparent and human-centred design**.

In this context, Omexco has an essential role to play. Our


approach integrates artisanal techniques carried out close to the origin of the materials, as well as specialised expertise performed in our own ateliers, such as screen printing in Belgium. All of this is underpinned by solid industrial mastery, allowing us to navigate these changes while ensuring quality and precision.

What do you want people to feel or experience when they encounter our creations?

I want people to **feel immersed in our creations**, as if the material and its craftsmanship reflect exactly what they have been searching for. I want the material to speak for itself - **through its texture, richness and quality** - and for them to sense the care in every detail, the mastery of the craft and the pursuit of balance between aesthetics and technical refinement. •







Our textured non-woven wallcoverings consist of a non-woven backing on which a design is printed: exuberant tropical prints, geometric shapes, hand-painted patterns or printed plains.

All of them are made in-house at our Belgian mill. They are suitable for both residential and contract projects, as they are fire-rated, easy to clean, and marine certified.



Mica wallcoverings are created from natural mica minerals that are heat-expanded and crushed into shimmering flakes, then applied to a backing to form a subtly reflective, textured surface. This gives walls a refined, mineral look with depth and variation.

We use different sizes and finishes of mica to achieve effects ranging from smooth to more natural and tactile, while maintaining environmentally responsible production and good durability. It is considered an Omexco icon and remains one of the **brand's most recognisable and celebrated wallcovering design.**

STYLE DEFINITION

Defining our style is something I get asked about all the time, and it's actually a tricky one to answer. We're always trying to reinvent ourselves and avoid repeating the same thing. Every project is unique and completely tailored to the client. And when it comes to renovations, we make sure to respect the existing architecture. Over the years we've done everything from a modern villa to classical townhouses to brand-new showrooms. Each project starts from a different angle and that's why the results are always different too. That said, there is a common thread running through our work: a focus on cosiness, warm colours, and the use of vintage design.


INSPIRATION

The clients, a young family, dreamed of keeping the home's original elements intact while giving it a contemporary twist, something that wouldn't feel too familiar or predictable, but instead a true reflection of their character, enriched with today's comfort and luxury. Their townhouse, set in the heart of Ghent and dating back to the late 19th century, carries the weight of history yet opens itself to new interpretations. The spark for the project came from the bathroom floor tiles: two-tone Fornace Brioni pieces with a soft, organic shape. That organic language soon became the guiding thread of the design, reappearing in the custom woodwork, the marble details, and the subtle flow of each space.

WALLCOVERING CHOICE

Choosing wallcovering here made sense because the couple themselves have a very warm and welcoming character. They are avid readers, passionate about music, and love collecting curiosities during their travels. ▶

There is a *common thread* running through our work; a focus on cosiness, warm colours, and the use of vintage design.



The space, in turn, had to reflect that same warmth. A plain white wall would never have felt right here. Instead, the home needed to become a cosy cocoon, a place where both of them could work comfortably, even side by side, while still feeling surrounded by intimacy and character. The wallcovering radiates this warmth and pairs perfectly with the rounded oak floorboards, adding yet another layer of softness and comfort to the space.

WHAT MAKES A PROJECT FINISHED

Knowing when a project is truly finished comes down to the level of finish and attention to detail, which in this case stood out, even within our tradition of high craftsmanship. Everyone involved was pushed to their very limits. When I first presented the designs to the contractors, their jaws dropped, but once the project was completed, they were justifiably bursting with pride. The puzzle, which in my mind had already been perfectly pieced together from the start, had finally come to life. •

I. TACTILE CABINETS



“When, during a similar project, such alchemy occurred—such a synergy of shared dialogue—suddenly incredible realisations became possible. The collection which I created for Omexco ‘dressed’ the walls like a perfect garment.

The geometric designs were variable, soberly eclectic, and they determined the soul of the house – all at once interior settings were revealed, which could become protagonists: sober yet majestic, they changed shape and shaped our aesthetic taste; we felt captivated by those fascinating architectural icons. The wallcovering collection Simone Micheli created harmony

which transcribed fragments on our walls that testified to our era, unique and characteristic: dynamic in dimension, fluid, evolving – dreams which created a ‘home’ in the present and in the future, for the metropolitan human being we all embodied.

Maison Margiela created an unprecedented wallcovering collection, featuring emblematic trompe-l'œil, reinterpreted motifs, a mix of textures, and optical illusions.

Beyond the conception of its collections, Maison Margiela's universe is clearly recognisable from its showrooms to its boutiques. Through the use of white, cotton fabric, trompe-l'œil, and the anachronistic mixing of styles and époques, the Maison carved the framework of an entirely unique, poetic, and enigmatic identity.

By blending humour with elegance, avant-garde ideals with classic tastes, reinterpreting objects of all forms and sizes, and playing with false pretences, Maison Margiela deconstructed shape and volume and moulded a conceptual, one-of-a-kind aesthetic realm.

The patterns create a type of visual language across the collection. Sometimes they are simple gestures with subtle tones and shifts, while others are a bit more bold and dramatic. Taken together they are like a movie soundtrack that advances the story without calling too much attention to itself.


Wallcoverings of this quality are like a stage. They may not be the main event, but they always enhance and enrich the experience.

The patterns are meant to feel familiar, almost classic or archetypal but they also come across as fresh and contemporary. This gives them the flexibility to work in a variety of contexts and applications.

We specialise in the design of hospitality environments, so we are especially impressed with the performance and durability of the collection. Omexco has produced an IMO-certified wallcovering that doesn't look like an IMO-certified wallcovering.

The colour palette is rich and sophisticated. It is unabashedly of this time but has the depth and richness of a classic selection that feels timeless and enduring. The darker contrasting colours give the palette strength and solidity; they're perfect for smaller spaces that call out for a dash of drama. The muted tones evoke a subtle sense of nature and calm, offering an oasis or sense of respite. And the neutrals bring the collection a measure of flexibility that works in a variety of applications.” •

ABOUT KIM MUPANGILAI

Kim Mupangilai a **Belgian-Congolese interior architect**, sculptural furniture designer, and professor at Parsons School of Design in New York. Her work bridges cultural storytelling and material exploration to create cross-cultural pieces that challenge conventional narratives in design.

Recognised by leading institutions including the Vitra Design Museum, Cooper Hewitt, and the Brooklyn Museum, her work has been exhibited internationally and acquired into museum collections.

In 2024 she received an international design award at the Boghossian Foundation's Villa Empain in Brussels, was named an AD100 Middle East & Africa honouree, included in Objects: USA 2024, and celebrated by Hypebeast as one of the 100 most collectable designers of the 21st century.

Mupangilai's practice is rooted in **heritage, womanhood, and resilience**. Shaped by her Belgian-Congolese identity, her sculptural work explores heritage, material, and form as a personal alphabet. Her design language contributes to an expanded vision of contemporary design – offering a blueprint for future generations where representation and intention are central.

ABOUT THE COLLECTION

Rooted in her dual Belgian-Congolese heritage, Kim Mupangilai's distinctive aesthetic comes to life in this unprecedented collaboration, one that Omexco is proud to share as a Belgian brand.

The collection highlights wood and raffia – rich, generous materials that symbolise the harmony between omexco and Kim Mupangilai. The iconic forms of her furniture design are reimagined in an **exceptional mural marquetry**.

Richly textured walls add warmth to the hallway, perfectly complementing vibrant art and offering a glimpse into a playful terrazzo-inspired kitchen.




